Other comments on the Evaluation

The second call (June / July) will consist of an exam or test type test that evaluates the contents taught in the subject during the course. Test with 20 closed questions with four answer options: a) b) c) d), of which only one answer is correct. For every 2 wrongly answered questions, one will be subtracted ask well. Unanswered questions (blank) do not compute. The students must obtain in the exam a

minimum of 1.75 points to add to the rest of the criteria. This subject is English Friendly, which implies the following commitment: The subject is taught in Spanish but the teacher has translated the teaching guide into English; Materials and bibliographical references for monitoring the subject in English; English tutoring will be attended; English tests and assessments will be designed and implemented (all this will be done if required the international student).
