Other comments on the Evaluation

- 1.- The evaluation system will be that of continuous evaluation.
- 2.- During the course, students will do practical activities and a seminar related to the subjects of the subject.
- 3.- To follow the continuous evaluation system, the student will have to attend class regularly.
